



# What is Dance of the Dragonflies

Dance of the Dragonflies is the 2010 installation of the Carnegie Arts Trail. This year's project showcases larger than life metal dragonfly sculpture, painted and decorated by commissioned artists, throughout historic downtown Decatur. Artists have drawn on cultural influences and the history of Decatur to inspire their whimsical designs, thereby creating dragonflies that come to life. The event is funded through individual and corporate sponsorships that have allowed a broad cross-section of the Decatur community to contribute.

## Who benefits from The Carnegie Arts Trail?

EVERYONE! The Carnegie Arts Trail is a family-friendly art event that will boost community spirit on all levels. The three and a half month public art exhibit will visually promote art and culture, showcase local talent, increase pedestrian traffic for the entire downtown Decatur business district and offer area businesses that are not located downtown, an opportunity to increase their awareness and participation in the community.



The 2009 installation of the Carnegie Arts trail featured 4 foot metal butterflies that may still be seen around town. Many have permanently landed in front of the sponsoring business such as the beautiful "Painted Ladies" located in front of the Carriage House at 115 Johnston Street. Numerous others are sprinkled throughout the downtown district including a "Butterfly Garden" located at Rhodes Ferry Park.



## Supporting Carnegie

The Carnegie Arts Trail financially supports the Carnegie Visual Arts Center and adds working capital to other public art projects including the Downtown Mural Project, a joint project of the Carnegie Visual Arts Center and the Decatur-Morgan County Chamber of Commerce.

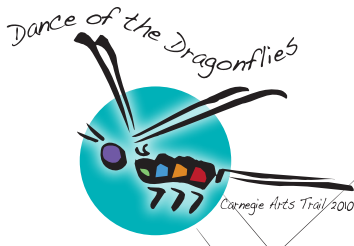
